The establishment of Rose Manufacturing Company, Walworth Street, Brooklyn, N. Y., was visited on Thursday, January 30, at 10 p.m.

No employees were found crocheting. The room in which they ordinarily work was padlocked, and when at the inspector's insistence, the padlock was taken off the door, found to be vacant with no evidence of current work.

Mrs. Rosen stated that they were not going to do any more work until they purchased machines.

Mrs. Rosen, George (the foreman), and Mr. Kirkle (father-in-law), and two boys were packing the snipping from inventory. One carton was noticed labeled to the Breneman Company (window curtains). Breneman is a New York outfit but this carton was addressed to Texas - evidently a consignment.

There is a strong possibility that the girls are still crocheting in some other building someplace in Brooklyn.
