EXPLANATORY NOTES WEEKLY REPORT OF MAJOR OPERATING STATISTICS HANDICAPPED WORKERS UNIT HEARINGS AND EXEMPTIONS SECTION

Item L: Status of Applications

This item presents the number of applications pending action at the beginning of the week, the number received during the week, the total available for action, the number acted on and the number pending action at the end of the week. It also presents the total received through the reporting date and the total acted on through the reporting date.

Item M: Status of Applications Acted On

This item is a breakdown of the data presented in L-4 above. It is to be noted that Item M-l-c "Applications Suspended" includes applications which are held pending receipt of further information. The cumulative figure of 494 applications is slightly inflated because current adjustments when final action was taken upon the receipt of additional information which had been requested were not made in the early days of processing of these applications In the near future, it is anticipated that this figure will be adjusted to its proper size.

Item N: Requests for Reconsideration

Practically all requests for reconsideration result from the denial of applications. Some are the consequence of dissatisfaction with the rates set in the certificate. The employer may think it is too high, or the employee may think it is too low. Item N in the main is self-explanatory.

Item O: Decisions After Reconsideration

This item is a breakdown of the data presented in Item N-4 and shows the decision taken after reconsideration. It is to be noted that a space is left for information on "Cortificate Rate Increases." There are no figures to present under this classification at the present time, but in view of the immediate increase in the statutory minimum and also increases of minimum due to wage orders, we may expect some action to increase certificate rates in the future.
