#### EXPLANATORY NOTES WEEKLY REPORT OF MAJOR OPERATING STATISTICS COOPERATION AND INSPECTION BRANCH

Beginning with this report operating statistics covering the activities of the Learners' Unit of the Hearings and Exemptions Section are included. The data covering these activities are presented in items P through T.

A change has been made in the form of presentation of data covering the activity of the Legal Branch which is presented in items I through K. This change does not affect the substantive data reported, but merely tends to clarify the description of certain of the activities.

Data on restitution presented in Section H are now more complete. Formerly information on restitution was obtained from the restitution receipts received in the central office from the field offices. In a large number of cases the receipts were not submitted. At present the "Weekly Field Office Activity Report" from CI-42 furnishes complete information on restitution.
