Complete operating statistics are now available on all major phases of operations of the Wage and Hour Division. The data on the operations of the Cooperation and Inspection Branch presented in this report are based on the Weekly Field Office Activity Reports, Form CI-42, for the week ending October 14th, except for the data covering the examination of reports by the Examining Unit in the central office, Item E. The data for this Unit are based on reports for the week ending with the close of business October 24th. Activity for the Legal Branch is based on the weekly report for the week ending October 21st. The data for the units in the Hearings and Exemptions Section are based on central office reports for the week ending with the close of business October 24th.

A new classification "Dropped Complaints" has been added to Item B, "Complaints Analyzed Classified by Type". Complaints are considered "dropped" if after being classified as "requiring more information" and every effort has been made to obtain the necessary informatiom, such information has not been forthcoming and a period of 30 days has elapsed. Complete information on "dropped complaints" is not yet available because all offices are not yet reporting this class of complaints.

Since the Cooperation and Inspection Branch has been operating on a decentralized basis, a large number of complaints have been submitted as a result of personal calls at the field offices during which the complainants discussed their grievances with representatives of the Wage and Hour Division. As a result, the proportion of complaints which can be finally classified has increased. On September 12th, when the Complaint Analysis Unit of the central office stopped analyzing complaints, the proportion of complaints "finally classified" was 78.6 per cent of the total analyzed. After more than a month of analyzing complaints in the field offices, the proportion of complaints finally analyzed is now 85.8 per cent.

There have been 15,724 complaints which have been found to indicate violations and these require the inspection of 12,283 establishments. Of these 12,283 inspections required, 2,617 or 21.3 per cent have been assigned, and 9,666 or 78.7 per cent are pending inspection.

Almost 27 per cent, or 702 of the 2,617 cases assigned, have been carried through to a final stage where they could be closed or dropped.

The number of cases closed or dropped has increased rapidly within the last three and a half months. On June 30th only 298 cases had
been closed or dropped. By October 14th an additional 404 cases had
been closed or dropped, one and a third times as many as had been
closed or dropped during the first eight months of operation. This has
been due in part to the fact that since July 15th the field staff has

had authority under certain conditions to settle cases involving restitution of not more than \$1500.00 without prior reference to the central office.

The effectiveness of this procedure is also indicated in the proportion of cases closed or dropped which have been closed by settlement.

On June 30th only 106 cases, or 36 per cent of the total cases closed or dropped, had been closed by settlement. On October 14th, 427 cases, or 61 per cent of the total closed or dropped, had been closed by settlement.

There have now been 38 civil suits won by the Legal Branch and 25 criminal prosecutions successfully completed. To date only two cases have resulted in adverse decisions, both in civil actions, and one of these is being appealed.

The Handicapped Workers Unit of the Hearings and Exemptions Section has acted on 5,365 applications or 98.1 per cent of the total received. Certificates for 2,253 applications providing for employment at less than the minimum rate for handicapped workers have been granted, and certificates for 2,486 applications have been denied. Of the remainder, 613 applications have been suspended, pending the receipt of further information necessary for the determination of what action shall be taken and 13 applications have been cancelled or withdrawn.

The Loarners Unit of the Hearings and Exemptions Section has acted on 827 applications or 76 per cent of the total received. Of the 827

applications for certificates for employment at less than the minimum rate for learners, 601 have been granted, 163 denied, 53 suspended pending the results of industry hearings or findings, and 10 have been cancelled or withdrawn. A large proportion of the applications for learners certificates originate in the hosiery industry.
