#### SEMI-MONTHLY REPORT OF MAJOR OPERATING STATISTICS WAGE AND HOUR DIVISION March 15, 1940

#### INTRODUCTION

This semi-monthly report of major operating statistics covers the period from March 1 through March 15, 1940, inclusive, and presents salient information covering operations for the period. Cumulative data from the beginning of the Act through March 15, 1940 are also presented. Certain of the data on enforcement and litigation, presented in Sections A to I, inclusive, are also presented in a series of appendix tables which show regional as well as summary totals. These tables are numbered to correspond with the sections of the report which they amplify.

Several of the tables in the appendix now afford a quick comparison of the net change in the activity reported, cumulatively from one report to another and separately from one reporting interval to another. The figures in several of the Regions for this period and the previous reporting period have been revised to conform with inventories recently taken in a number of the Regional Offices.

The sections on exemption for handicapped workers have been revised so as to show the status of certificates granted and denials issued and a summary of actions taken by the Handicapped Workers Unit. Section J presents a summary of certificates granted and denials issued and Section K a summary of actions taken.

#### VOLUME OF WORK

Final action was taken on 220 cases during this semi-monthly period.

This represents an increase of 6 per cent over the 208 cases finally acted

on during the last half of February. At the same time, however, 1,210 additional establishments were found to require inspection during this half month, as compared with 954 additional establishments found to require inspection during the preceding half month. As a result there was an increase of 990 or five per cent in the number of cases pending final action this period as compared with an increase of 746 or 4 per cent during the previous period.

Since the provisions of the Act increasing minimum and overtime wage requirements became effective October 24, 1939 there has been an average of over 1,050 new establishments requiring inspections each half month. During this same period the average number of cases on which final action is taken each half month has risen from 75 to over 200. In other words the current rate of closing cases has accelerated approximately 3 times the average rate at which cases were being closed prior to October 24, 1939.

Complaints were received against 1,325 establishments, making a total of 33,000 establishments complained against to date. This represented an increase of 127 establishments or 11 per cent from the 1,198 establishments complained against during the previous period. Based on the analysis of complaints through March 15th, there have been 23,917 establishments found to require inspection. The chief sources of establishments complained against are Region II which is responsible for 17 per cent and Region XI which is responsible for 13 per cent.

STATUS OF INSPECTIONS

Of the 23,917 inspections required by the complaints presumed to be valid, 3,112 or 13 per cent of them have been completed, and 20,805

or 87 per cent are pending completion, the proportion of inspections completed and pending completion being the same as for the last period. During this reporting period 267 inspection assignments were completed, an increase of 115 or 76 per cent over the 152 completed during the preceding period. At this rate the staff will complete well over 500 inspections a month.

Of the 20,805 inspections pending completion, 4,108 or 20 per cent are in the process of inspection and 16,697 or 80 per cent are pending assignment. The inspections in process include those which are being held by the inspector while he completes his previous assignments, those on which the inspector is actually working, and those on which the inspector has completed his report but which are awaiting review before being forwarded to Washington.

The 267 inspection assignments completed represent an average of one inspection assignment completed per inspector during this reporting period for the 264 inspectors on duty, as compared with six-tenths of an inspection assignment completed by the 263 inspectors on duty during the previous half month. There is an average of 15 inspections in process in the hands of each inspector and an average of 63 inspections per inspector pending assignment.

#### CASES ON WHICH FINAL ACTION HAS BEEN TAKEN

During the last half of February final action was taken on 220 cases, making a total of 1,843 cases on which final action has been taken to date. Of this total, 1,654 or 90 per cent were found to come

under the provisions of the Act and full inspection was made; and 189 or 10 per cent were found not to be covered by the Act and were dropped. Of the 1,654 cases in which full inspection was made, 1,320 or 80 per cent were closed by settlement after violations found had been corrected and 334 or 20 per cent were closed after the employer was found to be in compliance. From these facts it would appear that of establishments complained against which are in the enforcement area, four out of five are violating provisions of the Act.

#### RESTITUTION SECURED

During the half month restitution amounting to \$88,356.13 was secured for 3,673 employees in 179 cases. The total amount of restitution secured to date is \$855,131.77 to employees in 1,320 cases which have been closed by settlement. In addition it is estimated that over \$50,000 has been made as partial payments on cases which have not yet been closed. It is also estimated that if all restitution which has been found due by the inspection staff is eventually paid, the amount will be over \$5,000,000.

The average amount of restitution paid per case is \$647.83 and the average amount of restitution paid per employee is \$20.57. The average per case varies from a low of \$256.38 in Region III to a high of \$2,387.07 per case in Region VII. The average per case varies from \$10.75 in Region I to \$64.45 in Region XI.

#### LITIGATION

During the last half of February legal actions were instituted in 18 cases, all of which were civil suits. During this period consent decrees were entered in 15 cases. Four criminal actions were closed. In three of these the defendant plead guilty. In the fourth he was

acquitted. In the cases in which the defendant plead guilty fines of \$2,000.00 were imposed and collected.

To date there have been 248 legal actions instituted, of which 170 have been civil suits and 78 criminal actions. Of the 78 criminal actions, 24 have been instituted by information and 54 by indictment. There have been 203 cases in which legal action has been completed, 156 of which were civil actions, and 47 were criminal actions. In the criminal actions completed, a total of \$262,350 in fines has been imposed and \$130,000 of this amount has been collected. The balance of \$132,350 has been suspended upon the condition that the defendants make restitution to their employees in full.

Of the 3,112 inspections completed to date, legal action has been instituted on 248 or 8 per cent of them, the same proportion as last period.

#### HANDICAPPED WORKERS' APPLICATIONS

During this period 105 certificates were granted exempting handicapped workers from the wage provisions of the Act and five applications for certificates were denied, making a total of 3,280 certificates granted and 2,620 applications for certificates denied. Of the certificates granted 79 per cent or nearly four out of five were granted on original considerations of the application, the 2,620 denials issued are approximately only two thirds of the denials originally issued. The remainder have been denied.

#### LEARNERS' APPLICATIONS

During this period 42 applications were received from establishments

requesting exemptions from provisions of the Act for learners and final action was taken on 56. To date 1,752 applications have been received and final action has been taken on 1,544. Of these 1,544, certificates have been granted in 1,171 cases and denied in 364. The remaining nine applications have been either cancelled or withdrawn.
