This is in reply to your letter of June 8, 1970, concerning section 870.53 of Regulations, Part 870, pertaining to Title III of the Consumer Credit Protection Act.

The application of this provision will depend on the circumstances. In a case where a State adopts the Title III language for its garnishment law, for example, there would be little reason for delaying a decision by inviting comments. It is our intention to afford interested persons an opportunity to comment on applications for exemption whenever it is indicated by the situation.
