## WAGE AND HOUR DIVISION SCHEDULES HEARING ON HOMEWORK

Elmer F. Andrews, Administrator, Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, announced today that a hearing will be held at 10:00 A. M., on January 4, 1939, before Merle D. Vincent, Chief of the Hearing and Exemptions Section, at the Hotel Raleigh, Washington, on the subject of amending the Division's Regulations on Employers Records to cover the keeping of records for industrial homeworkers.

The hearing will be an open one and interested parties will be heard on the following question:

"What, if any, amendments should be made to Part 516 of regulations issued under section 11 (e) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, which would require special or additional records to be kept by employers of industrial home workers?"

Interested parties will also be heard on all aspects of the application of the Fair Labor Standards Act to employers of industrial home workers and to the employees employed by them.
