SCHEDULE OF INDUSTRY COMMITTEE MEETINGS

The Textile Industry Committee, authorized to recommend a minimum wage schedule for the estimated 600,000 employees engaged in the manufacture or finishing of cotton, silk, rayon and certain other yarns and fabrics, will meet Tuesday, March 21, in Room 3229 in the Department of Labor. This will be a closed meeting. At this meeting the committee will review in executive session the record of testimony on the economy of the industry compiled to date including the additional testimony received by its Sub-Committee D, which met on March 1 and 2 at Washington.

Sub-committees of the Apparel Industry Committee which cover an estimated 500,000 wage earners will meet in closed session on March 15, 16 and 17 at the Hotel Raleigh, Washington, D. C., to hear testimony from employer and member associations, provided funds for the committee members' travel and expenses are made available by the enactment of the First Deficiency Bill. However, if funds are not available, a postponement will be necessary. This meeting had been originally scheduled to begin March 6 and has been postponed to the later date at the request of trade associations for more time to prepare their presentations.

The Hosiery Industry Committee, covering about 140,000 wage earners, will meet on March 28 in Room 3229 in the Department of Labor, similarly to receive testimony.

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
