This Advisory Committee shall as expeditiously as possible report to the Administrator upon the following question:

"What, if any, additional regulations should be issued by the Administrator to provide for the employment, in sheltered workshops, of individuals whose earning capacity is impaired by age or physical or mental deficiency or injury, under special certificates issued by the Administrator, at wages lower than the minimum wage applicable under Section 6 of the Fair Labor Standards Act."

The term "sheltered workshops" shall include only those charitable organizations and institutions conducted not for profit but for the purpose of carrying out a recognized program of rehabilitation for handicapped individuals and of providing such individuals with remunerative employment or other occupational rehabilitating activity of an educational or therapeutic nature.
