## MESSENGER WAGE HEARING CANCELLED

The Postal Telegraph Landline System having withdrawn its application for permission to employ messengers at wages less than the 30 cent an hour minimum which becomes effective under the Fair Labor Standards Act October 24, 1939, Paul Sifton, Deputy Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, today cancelled (Federal Register October 18, 1939) the hearing scheduled on the application. The hearing was to be held before General Counsel George A. McNulty at the Bar Association Building, 42 West 44th Street, New York City, 10:00 A.M., October 20. Mr. Sifton's action is without prejudice against any person filing another application under Section 14 for permission to employ messengers at less than the minimum.
