NOTICE OF ORAL ARGUMENT ON RECORD OF
HEARING ON MINIMUM WAGE RECOMMENDATION
OF THE MILLINERY INDUSTRY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Notice of Hearing on Minimum Wage Recommendation of the Millinery Industry Committee, published in the Federal Register on September 15, 1939, provided that said hearing would be held before Mr. Paul Sifton, the then Deputy Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, who was thereby authorized to review the evidence adduced at the hearing and approve or disapprove said recommendation; and

WHEREAS, said hearing has been held before said Deputy Administrator, and parties thereto have been extended the privilege of filing, on or before November 15, 1939, briefs concerning matters adduced at said hearing; and

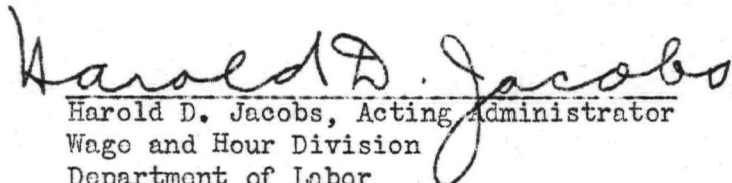
WHEREAS, due to the resignation of said Deputy Administrator, it now appears necessary to revise the procedure relating to the disposition of the minimum wage recommendation of the Millinery Industry Committee; and

WHEREAS, the said Deputy Administrator has turned over to the Acting Administrator the complete record of the hearing before said Deputy Administrator,

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ordered and notice is hereby given that:

1. Oral argument on the complete record of the hearing on the minimum wage recommendation of the Millinery Industry Committee will be held before me, on November 20, 1939, at Room 3229, United States Department of Labor, 14th Street and Constitution Avenue, Washington, D. C., at 10 A. M.
2. Any person who appeared at the aforesaid hearing in behalf of, or in opposition to, the recommendation of the Millinery Industry Committee, may present such argument, provided that not later than November 18, 1939, such person shall file with me at Washington, D. C., a notice of his intent to appear setting forth the length of time desired for argument.
