NOTICE OF CANCELLATION OF HEARING ON APPLICATIONS  
OF THE FLORSHEIM SHOE COMPANY, SELBY SHOE COMPANY  
AND SUNDRY OTHER PARTIES FOR PERMISSION TO EMPLOY  
LEARNERS IN THE SHOE MANUFACTURING AND ALLIED  
INDUSTRIES

WHEREAS, applications have been made by the Florsheim Shoe Company, Selby Shoe Company, G. R. Kinney Company, Inc., Medwed Footwear Company, Blum Shoe Manufacturing Company, and sundry other parties under Section 14 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, 52 Stat. 1060, and Regulations, Part 522, as amended (Regulations Applicable to the Employment of Learners pursuant to Section 14 of the Fair Labor Standards Act - Title 29, Labor, Chapter V, Wage and Hour Division) issued by the Administrator thereunder for permission to employ learners in the shoe manufacturing and allied industries at wages less than the applicable minimum wage specified in Section 6 of the Act; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was scheduled to be held on said applications in Room 214, Hutchins Building, 939 D Street, N. W., Washington, D. C., to commence at 10:00 A.M. on November 20, 1939; and

WHEREAS, representative employers in the industry feel that no industry-wide consideration of the question should be had at this time, and

WHEREAS, some of the applicants have requested permission to withdraw their applications in this matter,

NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given that the said applications are permitted to be withdrawn and the said hearing is hereby cancelled.

This action is taken without prejudice to the filing of new or further applications by those applicants whose applications are withdrawn and without prejudice to the consideration as otherwise provided for in the aforesaid regulations, Part 522, of such other applications as have been or may hereafter be duly filed in accordance with the said regulations.
