OSBORNE OF LELAND STANFORD APPOINTED TO RAILROAD COMMITTEE

George E. Osborne, a member of the law faculty of Leland Stanford University, Palo Alto, California, has been appointed a public member of the Railroad Industry Committee, Harold D. Jacobs, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, announced today.

Mr. Osborne's appointment is to fill a place made vacant by the resignation of Oscar K. Cushing, an attorney of San Francisco, who resigned.

The Railroad Industry Committee is to meet in Washington February 12 under the Chairmanship of Frank P. Graham, President of the University of North Carolina. The committee is to recommend a minimum wage for railroad employees up to 40 cents an hour. While 90 percent of the railroad employees receive more than this rate, it is estimated there are about 100,000 railroad workers presently receiving less than 40 cents an hour.
