
NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO SUBMIT WRITTEN
BRIEFS TO THE ADMINISTRATOR ON OR BEFORE
MARCH 5, 1940, IN THE MATTER OF THE RECOM-
MENDATIONS OF INDUSTRY COMMITTEE NO. 1A
FOR MINIMUM WAGES IN THE WOOLEN INDUSTRY.

WHEREAS, a hearing has been held from February 5, 1940, to
February 7, 1940, before Thomas Holland, the duly appointed representative of
the Administrator, at which all persons interested in the report and recommen-
dations of Industry Committee No. 1A concerning minimum wage rates for the
Woolen Industry were given opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence, and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Administrator to give opportu-
nity to all persons who appeared at said hearing to argue orally before him at
some future time, notice of which will be given in the Federal Register,

NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given that, as announced at the
hearing, the Administrator will receive written briefs (not fewer than 12
copies) at the Department of Labor, Washington, D. C., from persons who have
entered an appearance at said hearing, bearing on the issues which are before
him in this matter provided that such briefs are submitted to him on or before
4:30 P. M., Tuesday, March 5, 1940.
