## ARGUMENT ON RECORD OF APPAREL HEARING TO BE HELD

Oral argument on the record of the evidence adduced at the public hearing on the minimum wage recommendation of Industry Committee No. 2 for the Apparel Industry will be heard by the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, at 10:00 A.M., March 13, 1940, in Room 3229 of the Labor Department Building. The committee recommended a schedule of minimum wages ranging from 32-1/2 to 40 cents an hour for 28 classifications of the industry as carried on in the continental United States, and 30 cents an hour for Puerto Rico.

Persons intending to make oral argument must notify the Wage and Hour Division before 1:00 P.M., March 2, 1940, of their intention to appear and the amount of time required to make their presentation. Opportunity to argue the record will be limited to those who appeared at the previous hearing held from November 13, 1939 to January 10, 1940.
