HILL, BOSTON ATTORNEY, APPOINTED TO PAPER COMMITTEE

The appointment of Arthur D. Hill, Sr., prominent attorney and former Corporation Counsel of Boston, Massachusetts, as a representative for the public on the Pulp and Primary Paper Industry Committee, was announced today by the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor. (Federal Register, March 6.)

Mr. Hill, a former professor of law at Harvard University, will fill a vacancy on the Committee occasioned by the resignation of Professor Sumner H. Slichter, economist of Harvard University.

The Pulp and Primary Paper Industry Committee will hold its first meeting in Washington on March 18 under the chairmanship of John A. Lapp, Chicago publicist and educator. The Committee will investigate economic and competitive conditions in the industry, as defined, which employs about 150,000 wage earners.

The total annual production of this industry is valued at about one billion dollars, and is carried on in about 750 establishments.
