ARGUMENT ON RECORD OF HAT HEARING TO BE HELD MARCH 25

Oral argument on the record of the public hearing on the minimum wage recommendation of Industry Committee No. 4 for the Hat Industry will be heard by Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, at 10:00 A.M. on March 25, 1940, in Room 3229 of the Labor Department Building. (Federal Register, March 8, 1940.)

The Hat Industry Committee recommended a minimum wage of 40 cents an hour for the fur-felt, wool-felt, opera hat and hatters' fur branches of the hat industry, and 35 cents an hour for the straw and harvest hat branch. A 30-cent minimum was recommended for the straw and harvest hat branch of the industry in Puerto Rico.

Opportunity to argue the record will be limited to those who appeared at the hearing in December, 1939. Such persons should notify the Wage and Hour Division, on or before March 18, 1940, of their intention to appear and the amount of time required.
