HEAR ARGUMENT ON WOOLEN RECOMMENDATION APRIL 1

Oral argument on the 36-cents-an-hour minimum wage recommendation of the Woolen Industry Committee will be heard before Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, at 10:00 A.M., April 1, 1940, in Room 3229 of the Labor Department, Washington, D. C., it was announced today. (Federal Register, March 8, 1940.)

The argument will be limited to those who appeared and to the testimony adduced at the public hearing on the recommendation held before Thomas Holland, duly appointed representative of the Administrator, in February, 1940. Persons who appeared at that hearing and who wish to present their arguments must file a notice with the Administrator by 1:00 P.M., March 22, 1940, stating the amount of time required to make their presentation.

At the same time Colonel Fleming announced that filing of briefs on the record of the wool hearing had been extended to March 20.
