SNYDER TO HEAD WAGE-HOUR IN FLEMING'S ABSENCE

Baird Snyder, Assistant to the Administrator, Wage and Hour Division,
United States Department of Labor, was today deputized by Colonel Philip
B. Fleming, Administrator, to act for him in his absence.

Snyder was born in Lansford, Pennsylvania, in the heart of the anthracite coal regions, on August 17, 1900. He attended public schools in Lansford and Pottsville, Pennsylvania and also the Taft School, Watertown. Connecticut.
