REVIEW OF SEASONAL EXEMPTION FOR APPALACHIAN APPLE PACKING GRANTED

A review of the determination that the cold storage of apples in the "Appalachian area" is an industry of a seasonal nature, and thereby partially exempt from the hours provision of the Fair Labor Standards Act, was granted today by the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor. (Federal Register, May 23, 1940)

The International Longshoreman's and Warehouseman's Union petitioned for a review of the findings and determinations made by Harold Stein, Assistant Director of the Hearings Branch, Wage and Hour Division.

In granting a review of these findings and determination, the Wage and Hour Division announced it would receive briefs from interested parties either in support of, or in opposition to, the determination, provided that they are filed in triplicate with the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division before the close of business on June 15, 1940.

Apple storage warehouses in certain parts of Pennsylvania, Maryland, Virginia and West Virginia are affected by this determination.
