HEAR ARGUMENT ON PULP AND PRIMARY PAPER RECOMMENDATION JUNE 12

Oral argument on the record of the public hearing on the 40 cent minimum wage recommendation of Industry Committee No. 11 for the Pulp and Primary Paper Industry will be heard by Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, at 10:00 a.m. on June 12, 1940, in Room 3229 of the Labor Department Building, it was announced today. (Federal Register, May 25, 1940.)

At the same time it was announced that the Administrator will receive written briefs either in support of or in opposition to this recommendation on or before June 12, 1940.

Opportunity to submit briefs or to argue on the record will be limited to those who appeared at the public hearing held on May 20 and 21 before Henry T. Hunt, Principal Hearings Examiner of the Wage and Hour Division. Persons desiring to appear should notify the Wage and Hour Division on or before June 8, 1940, of their intention to do so, and the amount of time required to make their presentation.
