## FINAL HEARING TO REDEFINE EXECUTIVE, ADMINISTRATIVE, PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYEES, OUTSIDE SALESMAN, TO START THURSDAY, JULY 25

Final hearing on redefinition of executive, administrative and professional employees and outside salesman by the Wage and Hour Division will be held beginning Thursday, July 25. Representatives of the publishing, communications, transportation, public utilities and miscellaneous industries will be heard.

The hearing will be held in the Congressional Room of the Willard Hotel, starting at 10 o'clock a.m., with Harold Stein, Assistant Director of the Hearings Branch, Wage and Hour Division, presiding. The sessions are scheduled to last four days, through Monday, July 29.

The agenda for Thursday shows that representatives for the following organizations will appear in the order named:

Southern States Industrial Council; Motion Picture Producers and Distributors; National Association of Broadcasters; Automatic Electric Company; the International Federation of Architects, Engineers, Chemists and Technicians; National Association of Motorbus Operators; National Editorial Association, and the National Publishers Association.

Among the organizations scheduled for hearing Friday are the American Newspaper Publishers Association; the Hearst Corporations; the American Association of Schools and Departments of Journalism; the Book Manufacturers Institute; and Subscription Book Publishers Institute. The Book and Magazine Guild will have witnesses at Friday's session.

The American Newspaper Guild and the International Typographical Union will give testimony at the Monday session.

Similar hearings have already been held as follows: In April, on the wholesale and distributive trades; in June, the manufacturing and extractive industries; and on July 9, the banking, brokerage, insurance, financial and related industries.
