HEARING ON LUGGAGE AND LEATHER GOODS WAGE RECOMMENDATION
SEPTEMBER 5

A public hearing on the recommendation of Industry Committee No. 13 for a 35 cents per hour minimum in the Luggage and Leather Goods Industry will be held on September 5, 1940, at 10:00 A.M., Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, announced today. (Federal Register, August 14, 1940.)

The hearing will be held at the Willard Hotel in Washington, D. C., before Henry T. Hunt, Principal Hearings Examiner, as presiding officer.

Any interested person, supporting or opposing the recommendation of the industry committee, may appear at the hearing to offer evidence, either on his own behalf or on the behalf of any other person if he files with the Administrator at Washington, D. C., a notice of his intent to appear on or before August 31, 1940.

The Luggage and Leather Goods committee which made the recommendation was composed of an equal number of representatives of the public, employers in the industry and employees in the industry.
