NOTICE OF EXTENSION OF SPECIAL CERTIFICATES  
FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF LEARNERS IN THE HOSIERY  
INDUSTRY ISSUED UNDER REGULATIONS -- PART 522.

WHEREAS, special certificates for the employment of learners in the hosiery industry at hourly wages lower than the minimum wage applicable under Section 6 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 have been issued to employers, said special certificates having been issued pursuant to Section 14 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 and Regulations, Part 522, as amended, Title 29, Chapter V, Code of Federal Regulations, issued by the Administrator thereunder, and all said special certificates provide that they shall be valid until September 18, 1940, unless cancelled or modified for cause by the Administrator or his authorized representative, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary in order to prevent curtailment of opportunities for employment that the said special certificates be continued in full force and effect after the date of expiration thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ordered that said special certificates for the employment of learners in the hosiery industry at wage rates less than the minimum wage applicable under Section 6 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 be continued in full force and effect until the date of November 17, 1940 and shall be valid until that date unless cancelled or modified for cause by the Administrator or his authorized representative.
