HEARING ON EMBROIDERIES INDUSTRY WAGE RECOMMENDATION
SEPTEMBER 30

A public hearing on the recommendation of Industry Committee No. 15 for a 37½ cents per hour minimum in the Embroideries Industry will be held on September 30, 1940, at 10:00 A. M., Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, announced today. (Federal Register, September 14, 1940.)

The hearing will be held at the Willard Hotel in Washington, D. C., before Henry T. Hunt, Principal Hearings Examiner, as presiding officer.

Any interested person, supporting or opposing the recommendation of the industry committee, may appear at the hearing to offer evidence, either on his own behalf or on the behalf of any other person if he files with the Administrator at Washington, D. C., a notice of his intent to appear on or before September 25, 1940.

This recommendation was made to the Administrator in a report signed by ten of the twelve members of the Committee. One of the employer members was absent and one filed a dissenting report. The Committee was composed of an equal number of representatives of the public, employers in the industry and employees in the industry.
