EXTEND SAND AND GRAVEL SEASONAL EXEMPTION TO MIAMI COUNTY, INDIANA

A prima facie finding that the Kickapoo Sand and Gravel Co., Inc., Peru, Miami County, Indiana, is operating under the same conditions as the northern branch of the sand and gravel industry and is entitled to a seasonal exemption was announced today by Col. Philip B. Fleming, Administrator, Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor. (Federal Register, October 25, 1940)

If within 15 days of publication no objection is made, the finding becomes final and the company may work its employees up to 12 hours a day and 56 hours a week without the payment of time and one-half for overtime for 14 weeks in any calendar year.

Since the finding was made that the northern branch of the sand and gravel industry is entitled to a seasonal exemption because climatic conditions affect the availability of the materials used in the industry, the scope of the original exemption has been extended by several supplementary determinations.

The exemption for the Kickapoo Sand and Gravel Co., Inc., applies to its operations in Miami County which did **not** come within the scope of the initial finding. The payment of a minimum wage of at least 30 cents an hour is not affected.
