ANOTHER \$10,000 RESTITUTION PAYMENT MADE TO ATLANTIC COAST LINE RAILROAD EMPLOYEES

Total Now \$270,543

The Charleston and Western Carolina Railway Company has paid \$10,543.97 in restitution, making up the Federal minimum wage to 403 of its employees, Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, announced today.

A subsidiary of the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad, which recently paid \$260,000 in restitution to its maintenance-of-way employees, the Charleston and Western Carolina Railway Company runs through South Carolina.

Both restitution payments, now totaling over \$270,000 to 6872 employees, are the result of inspections made by the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor. Both settlements involved deductions for housing rent under Section 3(m) of the Fair Labor Standards Act. Negotiations for the settlements were made by Roy C. Frank, Supervising Attorney, Litigation, for the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division.
