HEARING ON SEASONAL EXEMPTION OF GRAIN STORAGE DECEMBER 9
AT CHICAGO

A public hearing on applications for exemption from the maximum hours provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act for the storing of grain, including soybeans, flax and buckwheat, separately, or in combination with grass or legume seeds, as industries of a seasonal nature was set today by Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, for 10:00 A.M., December 9, 1940, at the Chicagoan Hotel, Chicago, Illinois, before Harold Stein, Assistant Director of the Hearings Branch of the Division.

The hearing was scheduled on the applications of the National Grain Trade Council, the Millers' National Federation, and others.

The notice of hearing (Federal Register, November 23, 1940) stated that those desiring to be heard must file a notice of intention to appear with the Administrator at his office in Washington prior to 1:00 P.M., December 7, or at the hearing room in Chicago on or before 10:00 A.M., December 9, giving the name of the organization they represent, whether they are in favor of or opposed to the proposed exemption, and how long their presentation will take. A written statement may be filed in lieu of personal appearance.
