INA CTIVE PUERTO RICAN NEEDLEWORK FIRM GUILTY OF CRIMINAL CONTEMPT Rese Piazza de Ver:, doing buisiness as the Rose Needlework Company of Santurie, Purrto Rico, was found guilty of criminal contempt of court and fined \$500, with five days to pay the fine or serve a jail sentence until paid, according to word received here today by Colonel Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Departeent of Labor. Judge Angel R. de Jesus of the U. S. District Court for Puerto Rico imposed the fine.

The Wage and Hour Division had secured an order restraining the Rose Needlework Company from further shipment of goods worked on in violation of the Fair Labor Standard , Act. The company attempted twice to have the restraining order dismissed, c aiming that they had paid their employees the back wages due.

The W ge and Hour Division, however, secured evidence showing that employees had signed receipts for wages without knowing the contents thereof, that purport ed witnesses had not been present, and that wages actually had not been paid. Judge Robert A. Cooper ordered the company to bring its records into courrt. In the meantime, since the facts disclosed by the Wage and Hour Division .ndicated contempt of court, the Division brought criminal contempt action which . resulted in this fine.
