ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 86

DESIGNATING TERRITORIAL REPRESENTATIVE IN PUERTO RICO AS AUTHORIZED TO ACT FOR THE ADMINISTRATOR IN PUERTO RICO IN CONNECTION WITH THE EMPLOYMENT OF LEARNERS.

By virtue of, and pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Fair Labor Standards Act, and pursuant to Regulations, Part 522, Title 29, Chapter V of the Code of Federal Regulations, I, Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, Department of Labor, do hereby designate and appoint the Territorial Representative, or the Acting Territorial Representative, of Puerto Rico as my authorized representative with full power and authority to grant or deny applications for special certificates for the employment of learners in Puerto Rico, and to sigh, issue and cancel special certificates authorizing the employment of learners in Puerto Rico pursuant to the provisions of Section 14 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 and Part 522, Chapter V, Title 29 of the Code of Federal Regulations.
