NEW CHAIRMAN NAMED FOR MEN'S SHIRTS AND
SINGLE PANTS INDUSTRY

The resignation of William H. Spencer from the chairmanship of the committee to investigate and recommend a new minimum wage in the men's shirts, single pants and allied garments industry, and the appointment of Frederick H. Harbison, as a representative for the public and chairman, was announced today by General Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, United States Department of Labor. Mr. Spencer found it necessary to resign because of ill health. The new chairman is an instructor in economics at the University of Chicago.

The committee will meet at the Labor Department in Washington April 15. At that time it will receive evidence on economic and competitive conditions in the industry from employers and employees or representatives of either.
