IN THE MATTER OF THE AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS,  
PART 516, (REGULATIONS ON RECORDS) ISSUED UNDER  
THE FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT OF 1938

WHEREAS, a hearing was held on October 17 and 18, 1940, before Gustav Peck, Assistant Director of the Hearings Branch, Wage and Hour Division, on possible revision of Part 516, Regulations on Records to be Kept by Employers Pursuant to Section 11(c) of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060), and

WHEREAS, on the basis of that hearing Dr. Peck prepared a Report to the Administrator and submitted with that Report a recommended revision of those Regulations, and

WHEREAS, in his Report Dr. Peck recommended a further public hearing on the revised Regulations which he has recommended,


NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held on May 12, 1941, at 10:00 A.M. in Room 3229, Department of Labor Building, Fourteenth Street and Constitution Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., before Dr. Peck to publicly consider the proposed revision of those Regulations.

Any person desiring to appear at the aforesaid hearing may appear on his own behalf or on behalf of any other person or may file a written statement. Anyone desiring to appear must, however, file a notice of intention to do so with the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, stating the section or subsection of the recommended revised Regulations on which he wishes to be heard.

The notice of intention to appear must reach the Administrator prior to 4:30 p.m., May 11, 1941 and written statements, filed in lieu of a personal appearance, must be received prior to 4:30 p.m., May 12, 1941.

Copies of the Report prepared by Dr. Peck together with copies of the revised Regulations recommended are available to the public at the Regional Offices of the Wage and Hour Division and in Room 5418, Department of Labor Building, Washington, D. C.
