HEARING ON BRICK WAGE JUNE 10

An industry committee recommendation for a 34 cents an hour minimum wage in the clay products industry (brick, tile and other construction materials) will be the subject of a hearing on June 10 in the Labor Department Auditorium, Washington, D. C., General Philip B. Fleming, Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, U. S. Department of Labor, announced today. The hearing will be before Henry T. Hunt, Principal Hearings Examiner of the Wage and Hour Division.

Any interested person may appear in support or opposition to the recommendation. Persons intending to testify are requested to give the Administrator by June 5 the name and address of the person appearing, of the person or persons whom he is representing; whether the appearance is in support or opposition, and the approximate length of time for his presentation.

The report of the industry committee recommending the 34-cent minimum wage is available for inspection at Wage and Hour offices throughout the country.
