NOTICE OF HEARING

IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION FOR THE
EXEMPTION OF THE DEHYDRATING OF CITRUS
PULP AND WASTE FROM THE MAXIMUM HOURS
PROVISIONS OF THE FAIR LABOR STANDARDS
ACT OF 1938, PURSUANT TO SECTION 7(b)(3)
OF THE ACT AND PART 526 AS AMENDED OF THE
REGULATIONS ISSUED THEREUNDER.

WHEREAS, upon consideration of an application filed by the Kuder Citrus Pulp Company, Florida and sundry other processors of citrus pulp and waste for the exemption of the dehydrating of citrus pulp and waste from the maximum hours provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 as an industry of a seasonal nature pursuant to section 7(b)(3) of the act and Part 526 as amended of the regulations issued thereunder, a preliminary determination was made that a prima facie case had been shown for the granting of the aforesaid exemption to the dehydrating of citrus pulp and waste, and notice thereof was published in the Federal Register under date of March 29, 1941, in accordance with the procedure established by section 526.5(b) (ii) of the said regulations.


WHEREAS, within fifteen days following the publication of that preliminary determination, the Administrator received an objection to such determination:

NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given of a public hearing to be held pursuant to sections 526.5 and 526.6 of said regulations at Room 229, Federal Building, Los Angeles, California, to commence at 10:00 a. m. on June 5, 1941, before Mr. Harold Stein, an authorized representative of the Administrator, hereby authorized to conduct said hearing, take testimony, and hear arguments for the purpose of determining:

Whether the dehydrating of citrus pulp and waste is an industry of a seasonal nature within the meaning of section 7(b)(3) of the act and Part 526, as amended, of the regulations issued thereunder, and if so the appropriate limits of said industry.

Any person interested in being heard on this matter may appear at the hearing or file a written statement in lieu of personal appearance. Written statements should be filed with the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, Department of Labor, Washington, D. C. at any time prior to the date of the hearing or with the Presiding Officer at the hearing.
