FARM IMPLEMENT DEALERS TO CONFER JUNE 24

The position of dealers in farm implements in regard to the section of the Wage and Hour law exempting all employees of local retail establishments from the 30 cent minimum wage and the 40-hour week will be discussed at a conference in Washington on June 24 to be attended by representatives of farm implement dealers' associations, farm and labor organizations, and the Wage and Hour Division.

The Wage and Hour Division has just completed a revision of its Interpretative Bulletin No. 6 dealing with the scope of that exemption. The new bulletin will be made public in a few days. However, the question of the applicability of the exemption to dealers in farm implements was left open pending further study of the industry.
