APPAREL LEARNER HEARING DECEMBER 22

Objections having been received to proposed regulations for the employment of learners in several divisions of the garment industry, a public hearing will be held on December 22 in Room 3229, U. S. Department of Labor Building, Washington, D. C. Merle D. Vincent, Director of the Hearings Branch of the Wage and Hour Division, will be presiding officer.

Mr. Vincent will act both as representative of the Acting Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division and as Special Examiner under the Walsh-Healey Public Contracts Act. Interested persons will be given an opportunity to show cause as to why either the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division or the Secretary of Labor should not adopt the proposed regulations.

As published on December 11, 1941, the regulations were to be applicable to the women's apparel and single pants, shirts and allied garments industries, and in the sportswear and other odd outerwear, rainwear and robes divisions of the apparel industry; and to the cotton garment and allied industries as defined for the Public Contracts Act.

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
