NOTICE OF ORAL ARGUMENT BEFORE THE ADMINISTRATOR AND
OPPORTUNITY TO SUBMIT WRITTEN BRIEFS IN THE MATTER
OF THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF INDUSTRY COMMITTEE NO. 34
FOR A MINIMUM WAGE RATE IN THE PROPERTY MOTOR CARRIER
INDUSTRY.

WHEREAS, a hearing has been held from December 1, to December 5, 1941, inclusive before Major Robert N. Campbell, as Presiding Officer, at which all persons interested in the report and recommendation of Industry Committee No. 34 for the fixing of a minimum wage rate in the property motor carrier industry were given an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence bearing thereon; and

WHEREAS, the complete record of said hearing has been transmitted to the Administrator;

NOW, THEREFORE, Notice is hereby given:

That the Administrator will receive written briefs (not fewer than twelve copies) on or before January 26, 1942, at the Department of Labor, Washington, D. C., from any person who entered an appearance at said hearing, and will hear oral argument upon the complete record of said hearing on January 30, 1942, at 10:00 a. m., in Room 7129, Department of Labor Building, Fourteenth Street and Constitution Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C., by any person who entered an appearance at said hearing, provided that on or before January 26, 1942, such person notifies the Wage and Hour Division of his intention to offer oral argument and of the amount of time he will require to make his presentation.
