NOTICE OF CHANGE IN DATE OF ORAL ARGUMENT BEFORE THE ADMINISTRATOR IN THE MATTER OF THE RECOMMENDATION OF INDUSTRY COMMITTEE NO. 32 FOR A MINIMUM WAGE RATE IN THE KNITTED OUTERWEAR INDUSTRY AND THE PROHIBITION, RESTRICTION OR REGULATION OF HOME WORK IN THE INDUSTRY

WHEREAS, the notice of oral argument upon the complete record of the hearing on the recommendation of Industry Committee No. 32 for a minimum wage rate in the knitted outerwear industry (Wage and Hour Division release R-1711) provided that the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division would hear oral argument upon the complete record of the hearing on said recommendation on January 28, 1942, at 10:00 A.M. in room 7129, Department of Labor Building, Washington, D. C.; and

WHEREAS, it now appears appropriate to change the date of said hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, notice is hereby given:

That oral argument upon the complete record of the hearing on the recommendation of Industry Committee No. 32 for a minimum wage rate in the knitted outerwear industry and the prohibition, restriction or regulation of home work in the industry is changed to February 2, 1942, at 10:00 A.M. in room 7129, Department of Labor Building, 14th St. and Constitution Avenue, Washington, D. C. before the Administrator of the Wage and Hour Division, and oral argument may be presented by any person who entered an appearance at the public hearing held on the recommendation provided that on or before January 31, 1942, such person informs the Wage and Hour Division of his intention to offer oral argument and the amount of time he will require to make his presentation.
