NOTICE OF ORAL ARGUMENT BEFORE THE ADMINISTRATOR
AND OPPORTUNITY TO SUBMIT WRITTEN BRIEFS IN THE
MATTER OF THE RECOMMENDATION OF INDUSTRY COMMITTEE
NO. 38 FOR A MINIMUM WAGE RATE IN THE TOBACCO INDUSTRY

WHEREAS, a hearing was held on January 19, 20 and 21, 1942, before Major Robert N. Campbell, as Presiding Officer, at which all persons interested in the report and recommendation of Industry Committee No. 38 for the fixing of a minimum wage rate in the Tobacco Industry were given an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence bearing thereon; and

That the Administrator will receive written briefs (not fewer than twelve copies) on or before March 11, 1942, at the Wage and Hour Division, United States Department of Labor, 1560 Broadway, New York, New York, from any person who entered an appearance at said hearing, and will hear oral argument upon the complete record of said hearing on March 17, 1942, at 10:00 A.M., at the office of the Wage and Hour Division, United States Department of Labor, 1560 Broadway, New York, New York, by any person who entered an appearance at said hearing, provided that on or before March 11, 1942, such person notifies the Wage and Hour Division of his intention to offer oral argument and of the amount of time he will require to make his presentation.
