NOTICE OF ORAL ARGUMENT BEFORE THE ADMINISTRATOR AND OPPORTUNITY TO FILE WRITTEN BRIEFS IN THE MATTER OF THE RECOMMENDATION OF INDUSTRY COMMITTEE NO. 45 FOR A MINIMUM WAGE RATE IN THE EMBROIDERIES INDUSTRY AND THE PROHIBI-TION, RESTRICTION OR REGULATION OF HOME WORK IN THE INDUSTRY

WHEREAS, a hearing was held commending on November 2, 1942 before Major Robert N. Campbell as Presiding Officer, at which all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard and to offer evidence on the following questions:

- 1. Whether the recommendation of Industry Committee No. 45 for a minimum wage rate in the Embroideries Industry should be approved or disapproved.
- 2. In the event an order is issued approving the recommendation, what, if any, prohibition, restriction, or regulation of home work in the Embroideries Industry is necessary to carry out the purposes of such an order, to prevent the circumvention or evasion thereof, and to safeguard the minimum wage rate established therein; and

WHEREAS, the complete record of said hearing has been transmitted to the Administrator,

NOW, THEREFORE, Notice is hereby given:

That the Administrator will receive written briefs (not fewer than twelve copies) on or before January 11, 1943, at the Wage and Hour Division, United States Department of Labor, 165 West 46th Street, New York, New York, from any person who entered an appearance at said hearing, and will hear oral argument upon the record of said hearing insofar as it relates to the prohibition, restriction, or regulation of home work in the Embroideries Industry, on January 15, 1943, at 10:00 A.M. at the office of the Wage and Hour Division, United States Department of Labor, 165 West 46th Street, New York, New York, by any person who entered an appearance at said hearing, provided that on or before January 11, 1943 such person informs the Wage and Hour Division of his intention to offer oral argument and the amount of time he will require for his presentation,
