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U.S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR WAGE AND HOUR DIVISION Washington

Trade associations in the textile industry today (Thursday) were asked by the Wage and Hour Division of the U.S. Department of Labor to analyze the possible effect of forthcoming minimum wage orders upon their industries. The request was made by Industry Committee No. 1, covering cotton, rayon and silk textiles, which will recommend the initial wage rates under the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938.

Donald M. Nelson, Chairman of the Committee, requested specifically reports on:

 The probable effect in the branches of the textile industry of a minimum wage order applying to the textile industry, as defined, a minimum rate of (a) 30 cents; (b) 35 cents; (c) 40 cents.

2. An indication of what the trade association believed should be the relation of the wage in each branch covered to the minimum wage in the textile industry.

Trade associations other than those receiving the request from Committee Chairman Nelson can also be heard by writing to Administrator Andrews of the Wage and Hour Division of the United States Department of Labor.

These reports, together with data prepared by the Eureau of Labor Statistics, will aid the committee in the formation of its recommendation to Administrator Andrews on minimum wage standards for the textile industry. The committee asked that particular attention be devoted to determining what effect minimum wages would have on manufacturer and consumer costs and on volume of sales and employment; and in addition that the various reports outline, if possible, the competitive relationships between the various branches of the textile industry.

Various factors affecting classification within industries, as dealt with under Section 8-c of the Act, were called to the attention of the trade associations. They were urged to present any problem arising thereunder in their analysis.
