Mr. FITZGERALD introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Labor and ordered to be printed

A BILL

To enable the Department of Labor to formulate and promote the furtherance of labor standards necessary to safeguard the welfare of apprentices and to cooperate with the States in the promotion of such standards.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-1 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, $\mathbf{2}$ That the Secretary of Labor is hereby authorized and directed 3 to formulate and promote the furtherance of labor standards 4 necessary to safeguard the welfare of apprentices, to extend 5 the application of such standards by encouraging the inclusion 6 thereof in contracts of apprenticeship, to bring together em-7 ployers and organized labor for the formulation of programs 8 of apprenticeship, to cooperate with State agencies engaged 9

in the formulation and promotion of standards of apprenticeship, and to cooperate with the Office of Education of the
Department of the Interior in accordance with section 6 of
the Act of February 23, 1917 (39 Stat. 932), as amended
by Executive Order Numbered 6166, June 10, 1933, issued
pursuant to an Act of June 30, 1932 (47 Stat. 414), as
amended.

8 SEC. 2. The Secretary of Labor may publish informa-9 tion relating to existing and proposed labor standards of 10 apprenticeship, and may appoint advisory committees to 11 serve without compensation. Such committees shall include 12 representatives of employer associations, labor organizations, 13 and officers of other executive departments, with the consent 14 of the head of any such department.

15 SEC. 3. Upon the effective date of this Act, that section of the National Youth Administration at present engaged 16 17 in a program to formulate and promote the furtherance of 18 labor standards of apprenticeship shall be abolished. All 19 records, papers, and property of such section shall become 20 records, papers, and property of the Department of Labor. 21 and all unexpended funds allotted or appropriated for the 22 use and maintenance of such section shall become funds avail-23 able to be expended by the Secretary of Labor in performing 24 the duties and functions conferred on him by this Act. The 25 Secretary of Labor is authorized to appoint such employees

as he may from time to time find necessary for the admin-1 istration of this Act, with regard to existing laws applicable $\mathbf{2}$ to the appointment and compensation of employees of the 3 United States: Provided, however, That he may appoint 4 persons now employed in the aforesaid section of the National $\mathbf{5}$ Youth Administration upon certification by the Civil Service 6 Commission of their qualifications after nonassembled $\mathbf{7}$ examinations. 8
