Mr. GALLINGER introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the District of Columbia.

A BILL

To amend an Act entitled "An Act to regulate the employment of child labor in the District of Columbia."

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That the Act of Congress approved May twenty-eighth, nine-
4 teen hundred and eight, entitled "An Act to regulate the
5 employment of child labor in the District of Columbia," is
6 hereby amended by adding to section six thereof a new sen-
7 tence to read as follows:

8 "Any person violating any of the provisions of sections
9 eleven, twelve, fourteen, or fifteen of this Act may be pun-
10 ished by a fine not exceeding five dollars, and in addition
11 thereto any permit issued under the provisions of any of said
12 sections may be revoked."

1 *And by amending section fifteen so as to read as follows:*

2 *“SEC. 15. That no child to whom a permit and badge*
 3 *are issued, as provided for in the preceding sections, shall*
 4 *sell, or expose or offer for sale, any newspapers, magazines,*
 5 *or periodicals, or goods, wares, or merchandise of any*
 6 *description whatever after half past eight o'clock in the*
 7 *evening or before six o'clock in the morning.”*
