The Committee on the District of Columbia, to whom was referred the bill (S. 3993) to protect the lives and health and morals of women and minor workers in the District of Columbia, and to establish a minimum wage board and define its powers and duties, and to provide for the fixing of minimum wages for such workers, and to provide penalties for violation of this act, having considered the same, make an adverse report thereon and recommend that it be indefinitely postponed, a similar bill (S. 4548) having been favorably reported by your committee.
