RESOLUTION

Resolved, That a special committee consisting of five Senators, to be appointed by the Vice President, is hereby 2 authorized and directed to study, survey, and investigate the 3 problems of unemployment and relief, including an estimate 4 of the number of persons now unemployed by reason of the 5 use of labor-saving devices, mechanical and otherwise, in 6 operation in the United States, obtaining all facts possible 7 in relation thereto which would not only be of public inter-8 est but which would aid the Congress in enacting remedial 9 legislation. The committee shall begin its study, survey, and 10 investigation as soon as practicable and shall continue such 11 study, survey, and investigation expeditiously and with all 12 possible dispatch and shall report to the Senate as soon as 13

practicable with recommendations for legislation.

SEC. 2. For the purposes of this resolution the committee. 1 or any duly authorized subcommittee thereof, is authorized $\mathbf{2}$ to hold hearings, to sit and act at such times and places dur-3 ing the sessions, recesses, and adjourned periods of the Sen-4 ate, during the Seventy-fifth and succeeding Congresses, 5 6 to employ such experts and clerical, stenographic, and other assistants, to require by subpena or otherwise the attendance 7 8 of such witnesses and the production of such books, papers, and documents, to administer such oaths, and to take such 9 testimony and to make such expenditures as it deems advis-10 able. The cost of stenographic services to report such hear-11 ings shall not be in excess of 25 cents per one hundred words. 12 The expense of the committee, which shall not exceed 13 14 \$10,000, shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the com-15 mittee. 16
